Our Maintenance Team continues to strive for excellence in maintaining our greenspaces, facilities, and playgrounds for our residents. Several late spring and summer initiatives include the replacement of existing park entry signs and planters, drainage improvements at Pebble Beach Park, and various painting, staining, and sitting bench restoration projects across the parks. The Wildwood Park District and Gagewood Lions Club are proud to be partnering on the funding and implementation of a paved accessible path connecting the recreational amenities at Sunset Park scheduled for April/May 2026! This path will connect the ADA parking space in the parking lot to the existing playground equipment, covered pavilion and grill, and public beach allowing us to meet accessibility standards for a park that is heavily utilized for active and passive recreation.

After gathering valuable input through community surveys, Focus Groups, and Staff/Board interviews; the Wildwood Park District is proud to have completed its 2026-2031 Strategic Plan! Adoption of the Plan and release to the public is anticipated in May 2026. This Plan will guide the District's short and long-term goals for the next five years. Through the Strategic Planning process, core programs with a history of demonstrated interest and success were identified to focus current District resources on. Therefore, the difficult decision has been made to suspend operations of the Schoolhouse Adventures Preschool program at the conclusion of this school year due to low enrollment and financial sustainability challenges. We extend our heartfelt appreciation to our dedicated teachers and to the families whose support and involvement have made this program a meaningful and successful part of our community over the years.

Finally, we here at the Wildwood Park District pride ourselves on providing community based programs, events, and park resources for all ages within our community. On behalf of the entire Wildwood Park District Team, we want to extend our most heartfelt gratitude to our community members for continuing to support us for all of your park and recreation needs.

General Information

Boat Ramp Keys

Annual boat ramp keys for 2026 went on sale January 2nd. Boat ramp keys open the launches at Pebble Beach and Sunset Park. To purchase a key, residents must present a current DNR boat registration for each boat/water craft that are listed in the resident's name, and Wildwood address. Along with your boat ramp key, you will receive one boat decal. You may purchase additional decals for \$10.00 each. Decals are required for any motorized water craft. Boat ramp keys are \$100.00, or \$75.00 for seniors 65+ and current/former military personnel.

Dogs in the Parks

Friendly dogs are welcome in the Wildwood Park District parks. Please be reminded that dogs must always be leashed and controlled by their owners, and owners must clean up after their dogs. Dog Mutt Mitts are available in most parks. Dogs are not permitted in beach swim areas per Lake County Health Department.

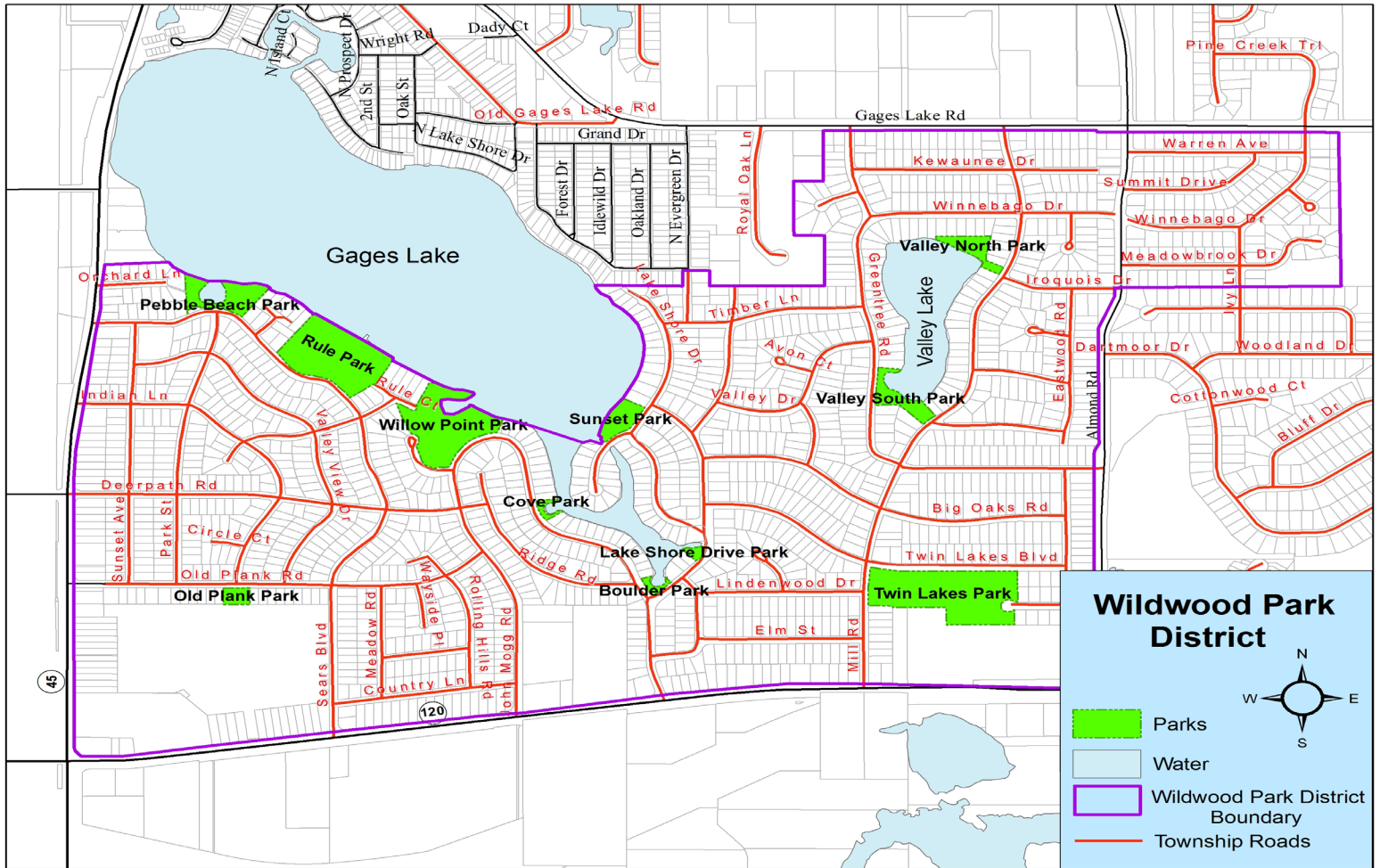

CHEMICALS AFFECTING VALLEY LAKE



PHOSPHORUS

It turns lakes and rivers green by stimulating algae growth. This reduces oxygen available to fish. What contains phosphorus?

SODIUM CHLORIDE

The most common, affordable, and widely used salt. The Chloride chemical in deicing stays in the water and can damage aquatic plant life, which in turn, reduces healthy vegetation that animals, fish, and other natural organisms depend on for food.

PESTICIDES

Designed to kill insects, fungi, or rodents — but once they enter water systems, they can harm non-target species. Even small amounts can:

- Poison fish, amphibians, and aquatic insects
- Disrupt reproduction and growth
- Damage immune systems

HERBICIDES

Damage to Native Aquatic Plants. Loss of Beneficial Vegetation. When herbicides kill non-target plants, lakes become more vulnerable to erosion, cloudy water, and invasive species.

EUTROPHICATION

excessive richness of nutrients in a lake or other body of water, frequently due to runoff from the land, which causes a dense growth of plant life and death of animal life from lack of oxygen.

- Natural slow-release organic (OMRI-listed) products
- Eco-friendly liquid fertilizers made from food-grade and organic inputs with minimal or zero phosphorus — ideal where water-body protection is a priority!



Herbicides use plant-based, organic, or naturally derived ingredients and can be good choices if you're trying to protect soil health, pollinators, pets, and nearby water bodies like lakes. Organic herbicides break down more quickly and tend to pose fewer long-term risks to ecosystems.



Consider biodegradable or gentler on the environment products than traditional rock salt. Many products use natural or less harmful mineral blends, plant-based additives, or biodegradable ingredients that help reduce harmful chloride runoff.



To help safeguard the health and long-term vitality of our lake, we kindly ask everyone to practice Catch & Release at this time.




